### 9. Consent Agenda

All items on the Consent Agenda are considered to be routine matters and will be enacted by one motion of the Council. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Councilmember or member of the public so requests, in which event the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered in its normal sequence on the agenda.

- 9.1 CON 14-13
- The Mayor and City Council shall discuss and possibly take action on approval of an Award of Contract with Visus Engineering Construction, Inc. for construction related to the widening of Honeycutt Road between Porter and White & Parker Roads. This contract, in an amount not to exceed \$1,572,383.21, will be paid from Transportation DIF, Transportation, Street Projects-Capital, Honeycutt Road at 7 Ranches South (32444146-67750-35020), and is in compliance with City of Maricopa Purchasing Code Article IV, Section 3-215 "Bidding Procedure." Discussion and Action.
- 9.2 <u>CON 14-12</u>

The Mayor and City Council shall discuss and possibly take action to approve an award of contract to EPS Group, Inc. for design services for the Edison Road Improvements project in an amount not to exceed \$396,505. This award is in accordance with City of Maricopa Purchasing Code, Article IV, Section 3-215, Bidding Procedure. The funding for the project will be drawn from Transportation DIF 1 Fund, Public Works, Design Service-Street Project (32444146-67755). Discussion and Action.

9.3 GRA 14-02

The Mayor and City Council shall hear and possibly take action to provide consent to submit grant applications to the Arizona Office of the Arizona Attorney General in an amount not to exceed \$25,640 for a part-time Victim Advocate Position. Consent to submit designates the City Manager to sign all documents for the application process. Discussion and Action.

9.4 MISC 14-29

The Mayor and City Council shall discuss and possibly take action to approve the allocation of up to \$5,000 in available matching funds to the applicants of the Maricopa Academic Scholarship Match Program from General Fund, Non-Departmental, Technical (10010000-53340). Discussion and Action.

9.5 GRA 14-03

The Mayor and City Council shall discuss and possibly take action to provide consent to submit a grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) in an amount not to exceed \$45,869,469 for the SR 347 Grade Separation. Consent to submit an application includes completion of all necessary paperwork for the application process and designates the City Manager to sign all documents. TIGER Discretionary Grants may be used for up to 80 percent of the costs for the project. USDOT may increase the Federal share above 80 percent only for projects located in rural areas, in which case USDOT may fund up to 100 percent if the costs of the project. The match amount of 20% or \$9,173,894 will come from General Government CIP fund and the Transportation Development Fund for projects currently requested in the FY 14-15 and beyond, Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget requests pending adoption. Discussion and Action.
