#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. Pastor Jim Shoaf from the Maricopa Community Church gave the invocation and Councilmember Nancy Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# 3. Proclamations, Acknowledgements and Awards

# 3.1 PROC 19-10 Small Business Saturday Proclamation

Mayor Price invited small business owners to the front to accept the proclamation. He read the proclamation and proclaimed Saturday, November 30, 2019 as Small Business Saturday in the City of Maricopa and encouraged the community to support local small businesses.

## 4. Report from the Mayor

Councilmember Smith reported attending the Maricopa Association of Governments' Economic Development Committee meeting and elaborated. Next, she reported on the last Senior Lunch & Learn and announced the next Senior Lunch & Learn would be to celebrate the holidays.

Vice Mayor Wade reported attending various Veteran's Day events, including: the Central Arizona College's (CAC) event, the Maricopa Unified School District (MUSD) Veteran's Breakfast, the Veteran's Day Parade (and commended Gaby Potter for the event), and the Flag Raising Ceremony at the Veteran's Center. Lastly, he reported on B2M, Boys to Men event at Leading Edge Academy.

Mayor Price commended the Buffalo Soldier presentation and reported attending it as

# 9. Regular Agenda and/or Public Hearings

**9.1** RES 19-58 A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Maricopa, Arizona, adopting

a revised fee schedule for the Development Services and the Fire/Medical Department. Discussion and Action.

Planning and Zoning Manager, Rodolfo Lopez explained the fee revisions requested by the Development Services (DSD) and Fire/Medical Departments. He explained the revisions added fire/medical fees that were not included in the 2018 fee adoption. He further elaborated on the Development Services revisions including: clarified language for lot splits, added fee for street name/number change, amended fee for Development Review Permit Applications, added Seasonal Sales Permit, and revised Temporary Sigh Permit title. He explained that the added fee for mobile food vendor would be generalized to mobile vendor per the City Attorney's direction. He asked for the amendment be included in the motion, to strike through "mobile food vendor" on the resolution item. Next, he detailed the revisions from the DSD, Engineering Division and asked that the sidewalk deposit fee be striked-out from the resolution and elaborated. City Manager Horst elaborated on a request for 90 days to work out the issue with home builders. He stated that, if necessary, it would be brought back before council as a deposit fee or modified. Lastly, Mr. Lopez mentioned the added code enforcement violation fees for the Neighborhood Services Division and recommended adoption of the resolution with the amendment of the mobile vendor fees and the removal of the sidewalk deposit.

Councilmember Manfredi asked for clarification on mobile vendors. Mr. Lopez explained that, per Arizona State Statue, it included any type of merchant vendors and the proposed fee was a one-type \$55 fee. Clarification ensued. Mayor Price asked if the process could be done over-night online. Mr. Lopez explained that because of the review process, it could be done within a week. City Manager Horst stated that a temporary permit could be issue online until the review.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Wade, seconded by Councilmember Smith, that this Resolution be Approved as Amended to strike out "mobile food vendor" to "mobile vendor" and eliminate the sidewalk deposit fee. The motion carried by the following vote:
