History on Project

- Site was proposed as a dog park through a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) process
- The CUP was not approved by Council
- City Council asked staff for information on turning the site into a neighborhood park
- Staff received direction to proceed with outreach on the park



Public Outreach


- Parks, Rec & Library Committee
 - Liked the idea of the park and voted to move forward
- Heritage District
 - District liked the idea of the park and suggested to remove the play feature, add another bench, more trees and a path to the turf
 - They voted to move forward



Park Improvements

- Park Improvements
 - Grass for the bottom of the retention area
 - Rock for the retention slopes and perimeter
 - Irrigation for the turf
 - Trees (6) for shade
 - DG path down to the grass
 - Picnic table, (2) benches, doggie pot, trash receptacle and curbing
