Narrative

Maricopa Wells Middle School is a 6th through 8th grade public school located within the Maricopa Unified School District, in Maricopa, Arizona. Our school completed the 2018-2019 school year with 930 students.

The overall purpose of this grant is to increase the amount of available technology for all of our students who attend Maricopa Wells Middle School. If we are awarded this grant, we will use the funds to purchase 10 laptop carts for our campus. Each cart contains 36 laptops, which will provide an additional 360 computers for our campus.

Increasing the available technology will benefit our students in several different ways. We are already fully integrated within our Math and Language Arts core areas with online curriculum. With that, due to our current limited number of available laptops, our staff are forced to share computer carts, so our students do not have access to the technology every day.

In addition to every day curriculum, as we all know, every school is required to complete the mandated state assessments at the end of each school year. This current limited number of laptops for our campus forces us to share those laptops to complete the testing process. Each year, we must create a schedule to share the laptops in order to complete those state mandated assessments. Since the state assigns the dates when those assessments must be completed, this can be a challenge.

With this grant, these additional laptop carts will make the curriculum more accessible for our students on a daily basis. It will also create a much smoother process of completing our state assessments each year.

This grant will service all of the students who attend Maricopa Wells Middle School. Our school boundaries start roughly at Acacia Crossings and the Villages in the middle of the city of Maricopa, including Senita I and II, and goes all the way south to Miller road in the Hidden Valley area. Since we cover both sides of the 347 highway going south, our school boundary includes all of the Ak-Chin Community. Since our parents and families understand the importance and value of technology in this modern era, this grant will support and build confidence in our entire school community, which covers a very large part of the Maricopa area.

The mission statement of Maricopa Wells Middle School is "To prepare our students for the high school level and beyond." This grant will allow the increase in technology to service all of our students, and help accomplish our mission of preparing our student for the high school level. Along with that, it will also help our students with future employment opportunities that this ever changing technology world is creating.

When we look at current resources, the Maricopa Unified School District has been the only support for our current technology on campus. There has been a multiyear process of slowly increasing the number of laptop carts on our campus through funds available to the district. Since there are 9 schools currently in our district, those funds must be shared appropriately. With this new project, these new laptop carts will benefit not only the current students, but the future students who will attend Maricopa Wells Middle School the next few years.

If we are awarded this grant, we will implement the process right away to purchase the carts. The district will start the purchasing process the same quarter we are approved. Having these laptop carts will be such a benefit to our campus, we will want to complete the purchase as soon as possible. All reporting will be completed in cooperation with the district. Since all of these grant funds will be dedicated to these laptop carts, reports will be finalized as we complete the laptop purchasing process to ensure all funds are accounted for appropriately. These reports will be shared with the Ak-Chin Community grant committee. I would like to thank you for the opportunity you are allowing us to apply for this grant. Having grown up in this area, I have seen the support that the Ak-Chin Community has provided for many years, and I thank you for that. I am excited for the possibilities and the benefit that this grant can provide for our students. Thank you, again, and I look forward to hearing from you.
