In addition, Face of a Survivor provided resources for 1200 individuals and 360 families; and

Whereas, home should be a place of warmth, unconditional love, tranquility, and security – gifts to be counted among our greatest blessings. Tragically for many Americans, these are blessings that are often tarnished by violence and fear; and

Whereas, women, men, young children and the elderly are all counted among the victims of domestic violence – too often resulting in physical injury and death. Emotional scars are often permanent as well; and

Whereas, we must recognize the compassion and dedication of volunteers and professionals, applaud their efforts, and increase public understanding of this important – and often hidden – problem of domestic violence.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nancy Smith, Mayor of the City of Maricopa, do hereby proclaim the month of October 2022 as **Domestic Violence Awareness Month** in the City of Maricopa and once again urge all citizens to observe this month by becoming aware of the tragedy of domestic violence and support community efforts in working toward its end.
