Census Background

- Enshrined in the Constitution.
- All persons to be enumerated every decade.
- Determines congressional representation and state legislative districts.
- Informs the distribution of federal and state funds.
 - Approximately \$3000 in federal fund eligibility and \$400 in state shared revenues.
- Point in time is set at April 1, 2020 this year.



Self-Response

- 2010 59.65
- 2020 65% on 10-12-20 (within the city limits, per Census website 61.1 on 10-12-20, 40th out of 91)
- National 66.8 on 10-12-20
 - State 63.9 on 10-12-20



Total (Non-response follow-up plus self-response)

- US 99.9 on 10-12-20, 97.0 on 9-26-20
 - State 99.9 on 10-12-20, 95.3 on 9-26-20 (43rd)
 - Tucson Region 99.6 on 10-12-20, 88.3 on 9-26-20

The 2015 Special Census data did not break down self- response vs. follow-up.
