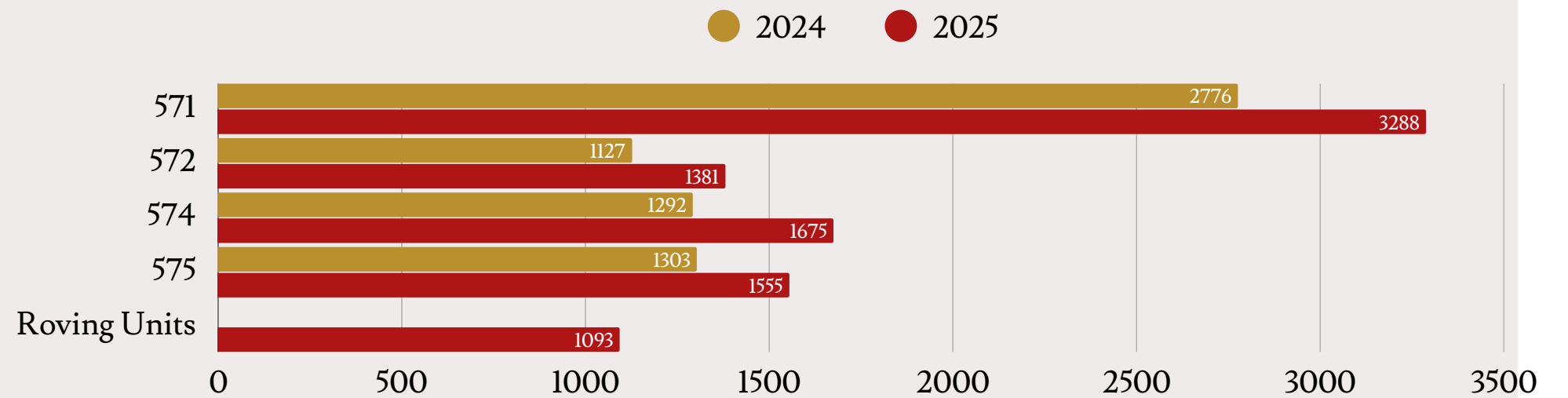

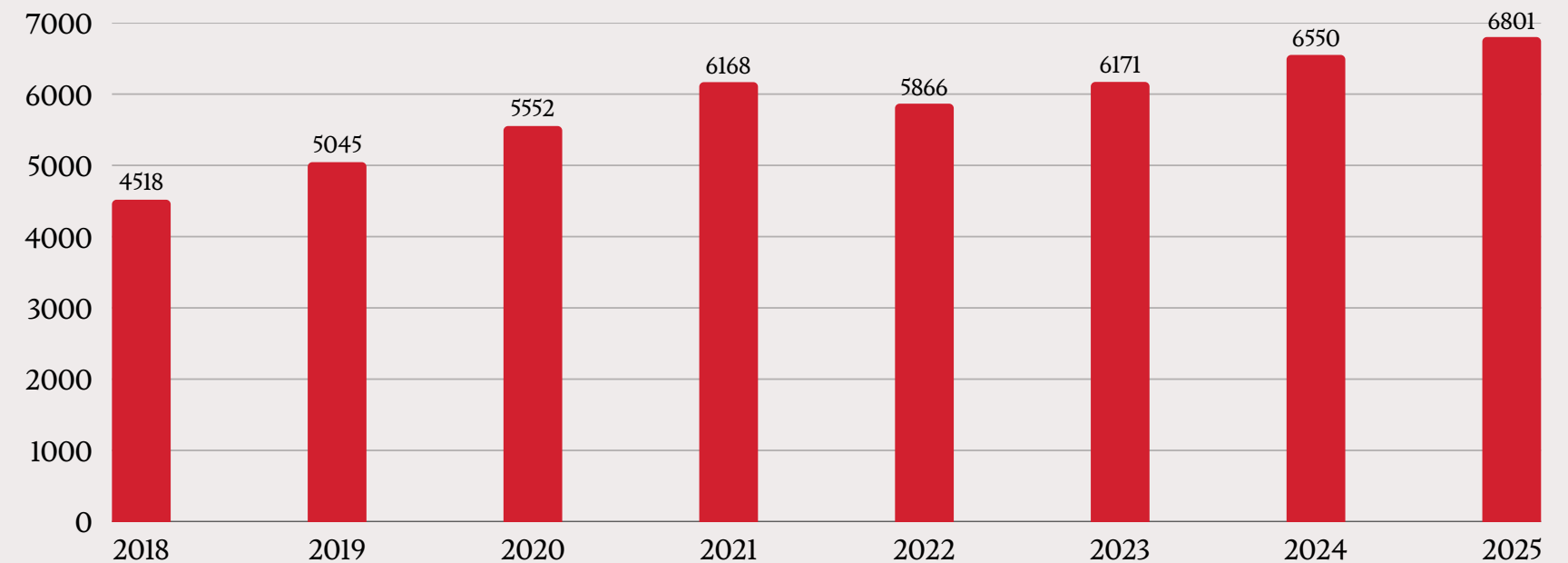

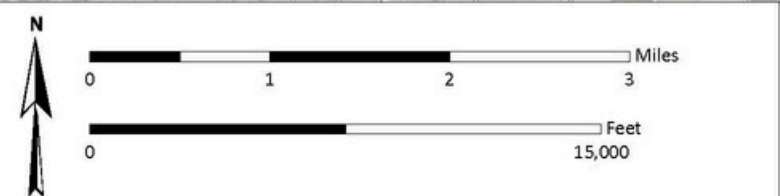

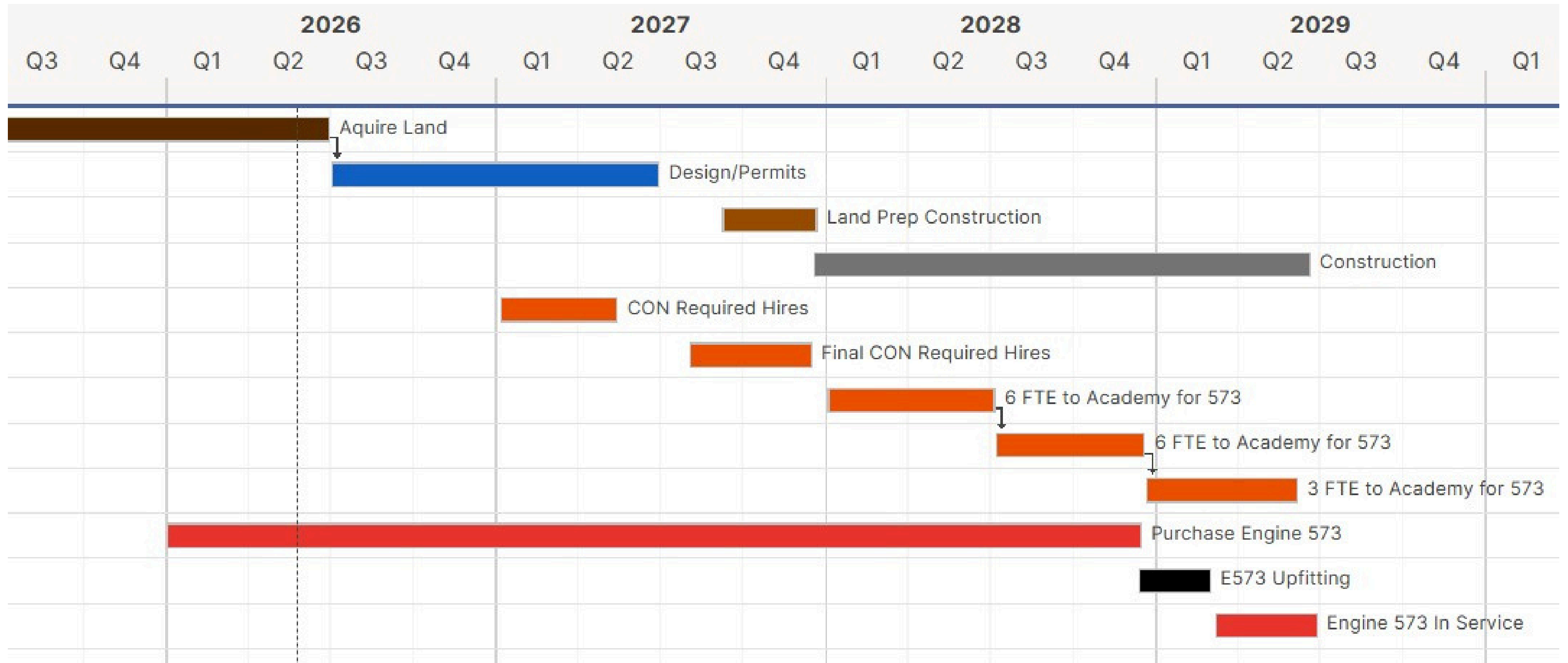

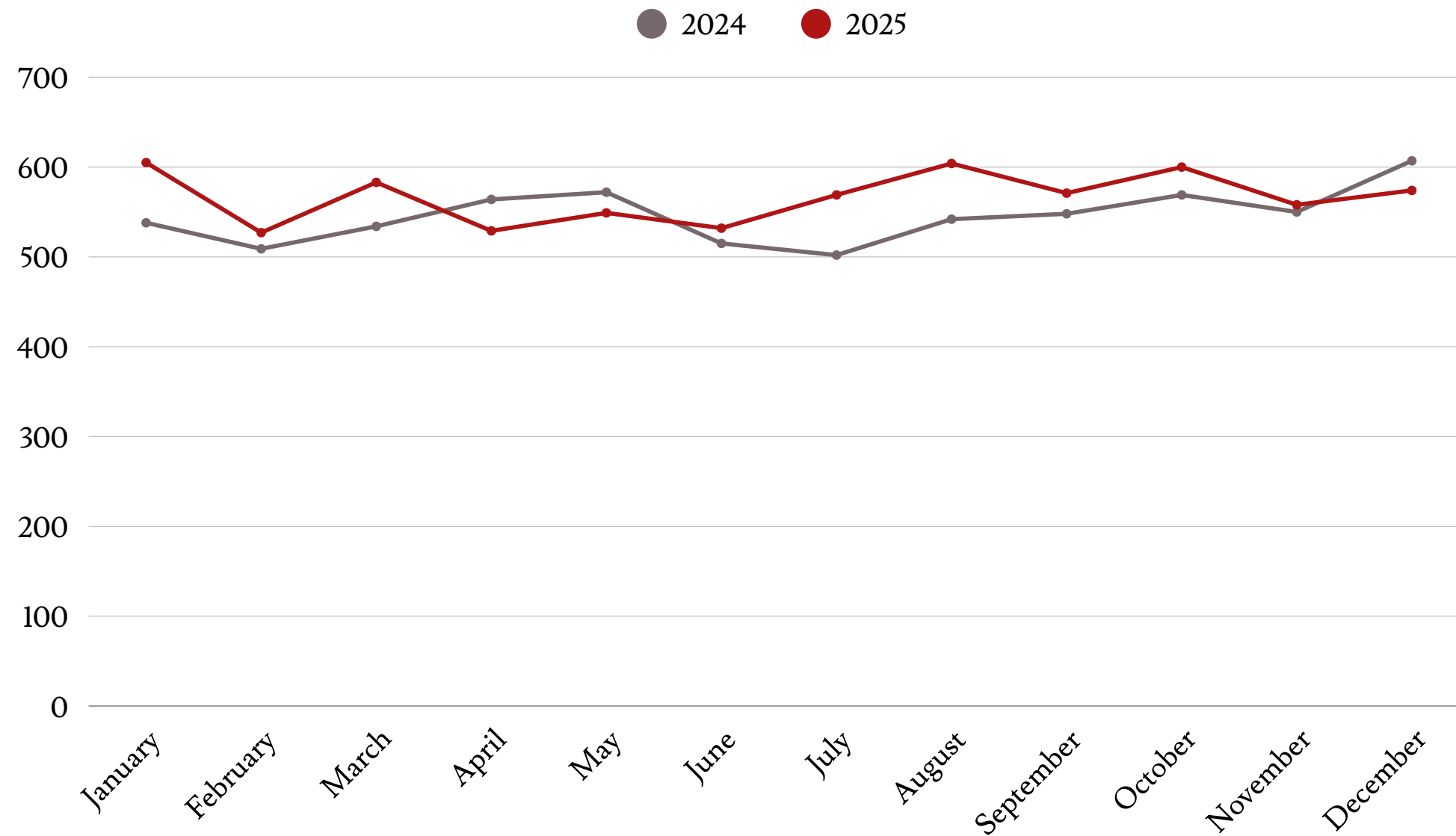

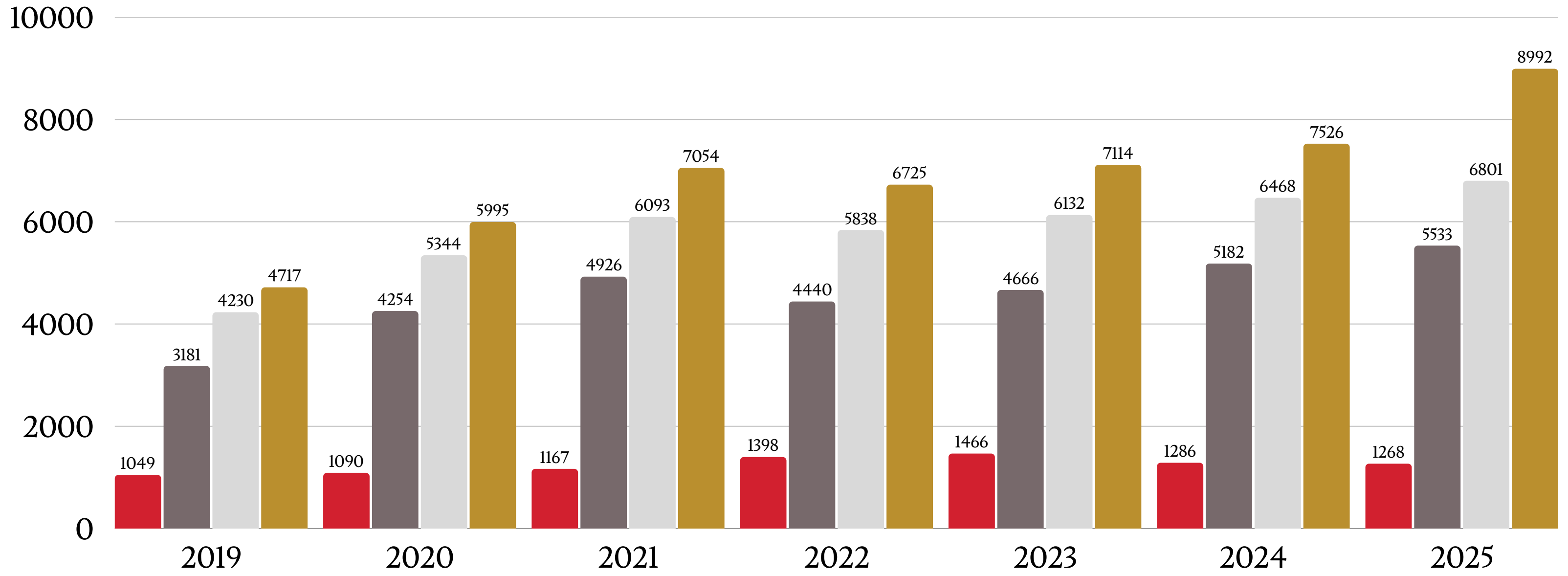

In 2025, the Fire Department expanded and created a standalone Fire Prevention Division.

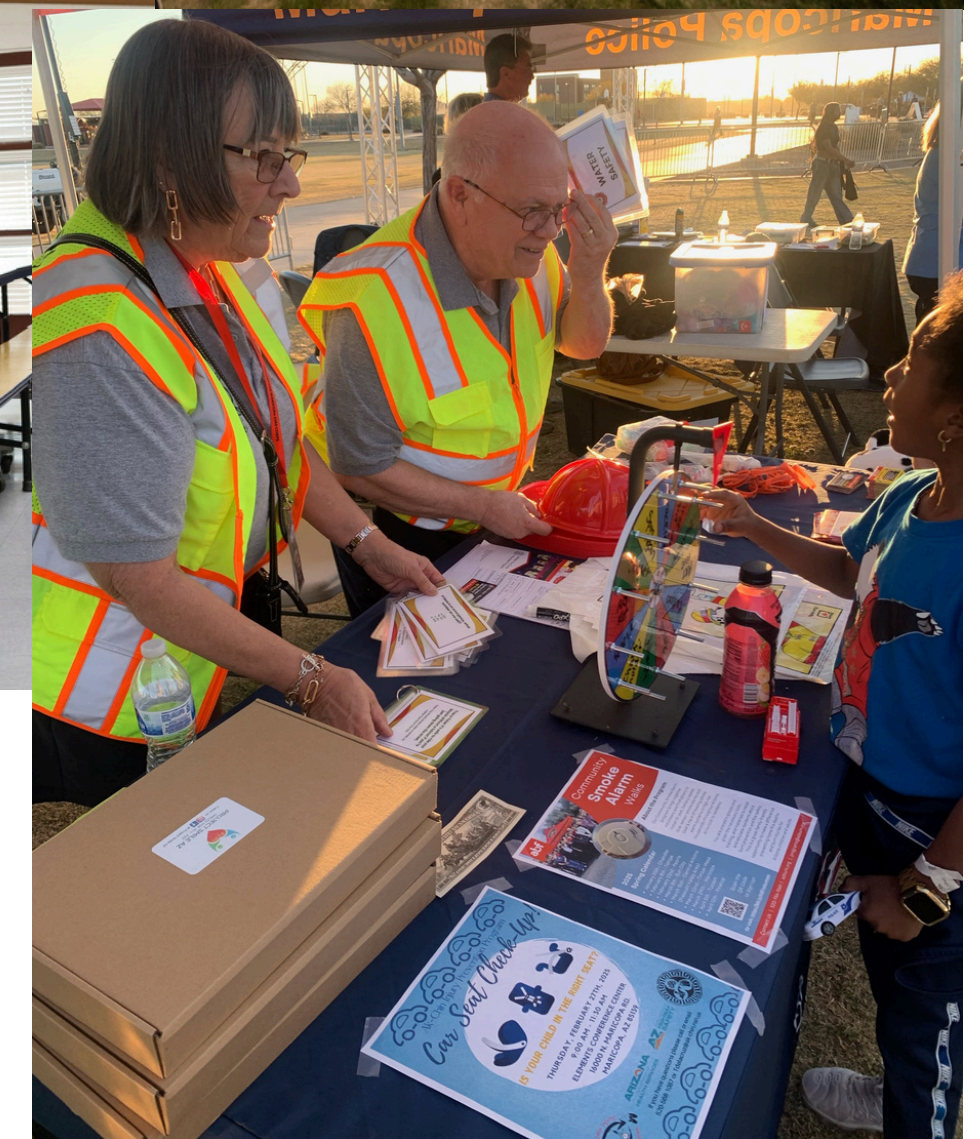
This division is led by Fire Marshal Eddie Rodreguiz.

SMOKE DETECTOR PROGRAM




Program Overview

The Smoke Detector Program was officially launched in 2025 as a new community risk reduction initiative.

The program provides free smoke alarm inspections, maintenance assistance, and fire safety education to help residents have working smoke alarms and knowledge they need to stay safe in an emergency.

Services Provided

- Smoke alarm inspections and testing

As a newly established program, the Smoke Detector Program will continue expanding appointment availability, volunteer involvement, and residential risk reduction efforts throughout Maricopa.

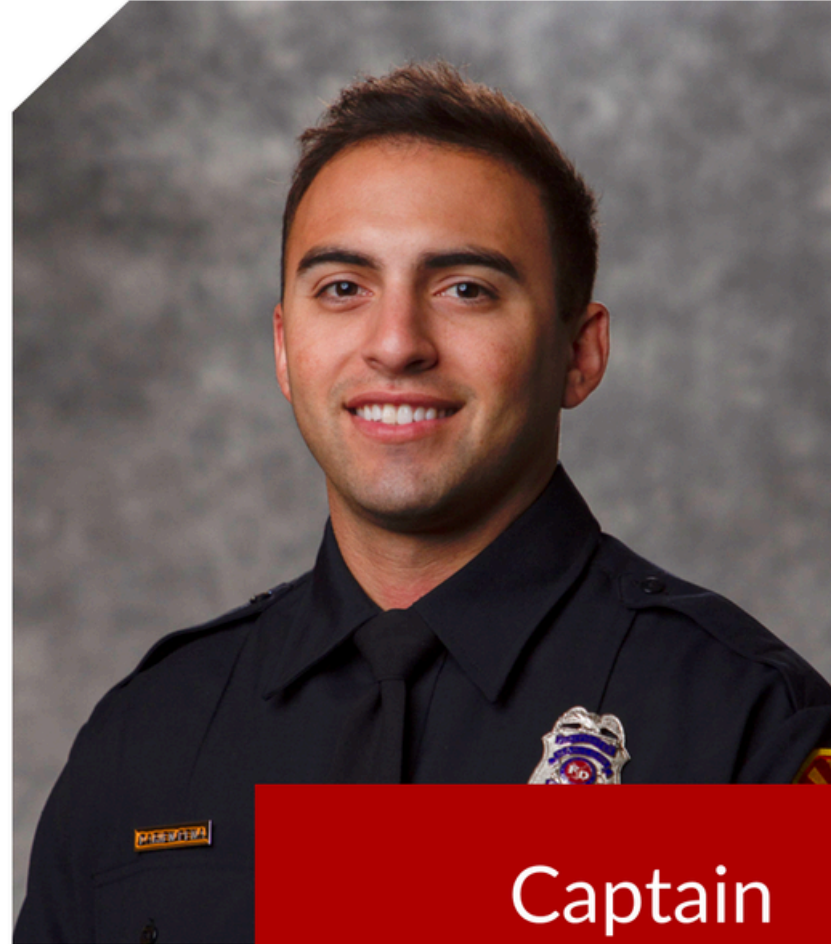

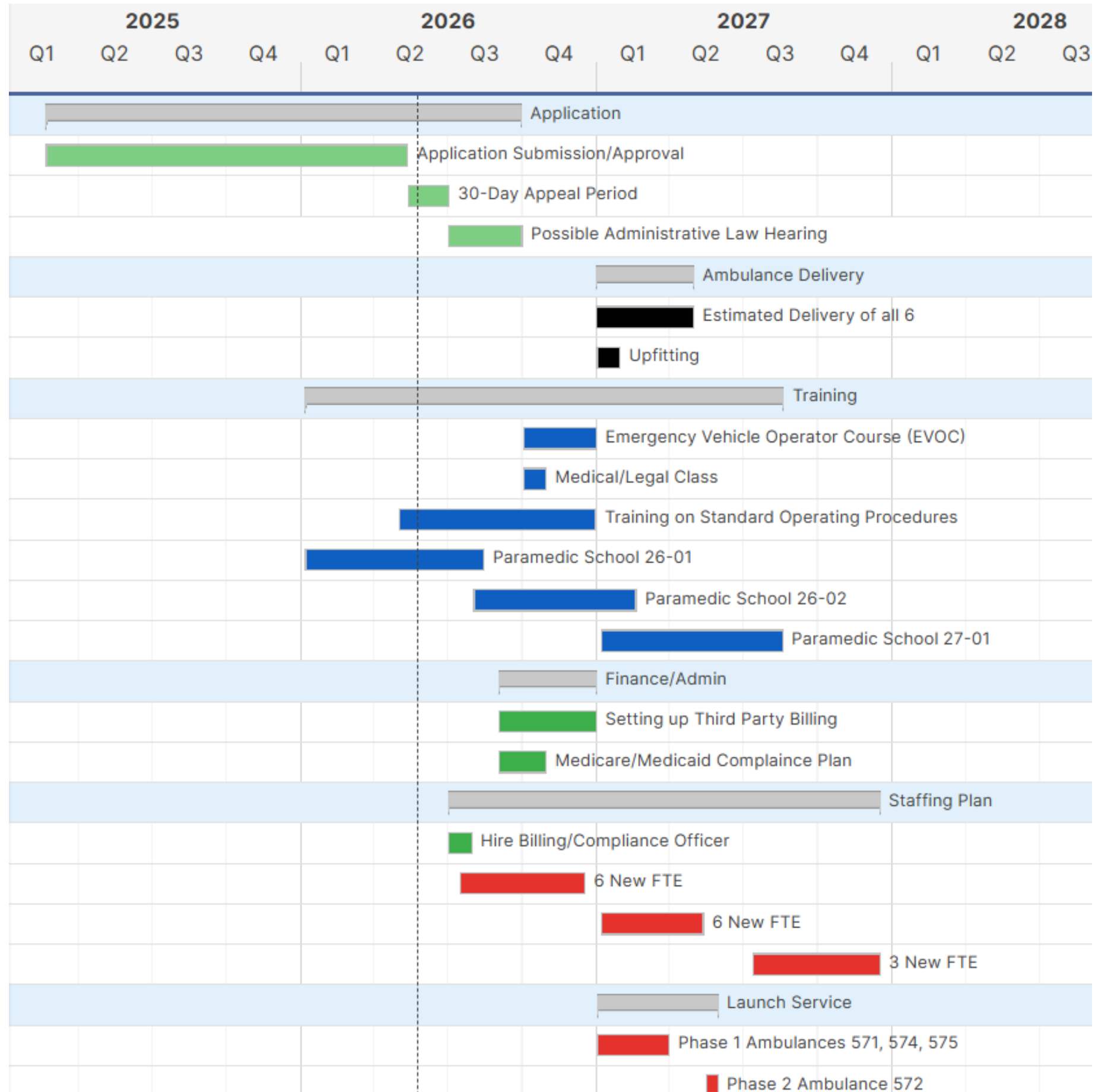
