# Free & Accessible Physical Exams for Youth Athletics Ak-Chin Indian Community Grant Application Outline

#### A. Purpose of Grant

Youth that are involved in extracurricular activities are less likely to engage in behaviors that are detrimental to their future success. According to the Institute for the Study of Youth Sports, high school athletes are 92% less likely to get involved with drugs, 80% less likely to get pregnant and 3 times more likely to graduate than non-athletes. The purpose of this grant is to provide free physical exams for the youth in Pinal County, thus allowing them the opportunity to participate in athletic programs within their schools and communities. The Arizona Interscholastic Athletic Association requires students in grades 6-12 to annually obtain a health physical by a doctor prior to participating in athletic events. The lack of availability of physical exams is a deterrent for youth who want to participate in school sports, especially in the City of Maricopa and surrounding areas where there is a significant lack of primary care providers who perform this service. Further, the free physical examinations provided through this program will include additional testing to diagnose cardiomyopathy, which is not traditionally included in athletic exams. Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy is viewed as the most common condition responsible for sudden cardiac death in young athletes. These deaths are preventable if a diagnosis is made prior to involvement in athletics and proper medical care is received.

This would be the inaugural year of this program; thus, the costs are higher due to purchases of equipment that will have to be made in order to provide these services. The program will require us to obtain medical partitions to create a mobile doctor's office at the school site where the free physical exams will be provided. It will also require the purchase and/or rental of medical equipment, including an EKG machine, to provide enhanced services to diagnose cardiomyopathy. Further, labor will be procured to set up and remove the temporary facility. Advertising and administration costs will be used to ensure that we reach the local youth and their parents. The cost to sustain this program in future years will be lower and we intend to continue this program utilizing the resources provided through the grant as long as there is a need and students are benefiting.

The target population for this project includes all youth in grades 6-12 in and around the City of Maricopa, including surrounding areas such as the Ak-Chin Community, Hidden Valley, Mobile and Stanfield. The lack of available healthcare in these areas makes it difficult for youth to obtain the necessary medical authorization to participate in sports. We anticipate administering at least 400 physical exams for youth in the first year. The majority of these will be provided during large scale one-day events in April of 2023. This will ensure that all youth who want to participate in athletics during the

2023/2024 school year will have the proper physical authorization to do so. Funds will be utilized to ensure youth and their parents can participate in these events through advertisement in local newspapers, including the Maricopa Monitor, InMaricopa and the Ak-Chin O'odham Runner. Limited funds will also be used to promote the project through social media, to reach the maximum amount of youth in the area. In addition, we are partnering with Exceptional Community Hospital – Maricopa to provide a limited amount of free physical exams for youth throughout the calendar year of 2023 to ensure that students who are unable to attend the events in April still have access to obtain a free physical and pursue athletics.

The goal of this project is to remove any barriers preventing our youth from achieving their potential. Providing free physical exams will allow students to participate in the sport of their choice, thus giving them a positive outlet to exercise and motivation to achieve. Through partnerships with the local hospital and schools in the area, we will encourage local youth to get involved in athletics, thus reducing their chances of making poor life altering decisions.

#### **B.** Resources

There are not any current funding sources for this project. If awarded, this project would be the first of its kind. The goal is to utilize this grant to fund the initial purchase of equipment and resources to provide free physical exams at school sites. Going forward, the resources procured through the grant will continue to be utilized to provide these services annually. Be Awesome Youth Coalition will lead this project. The mission of the organization is to develop confident, connected and successful youth through mentoring, education and community programs. Additional partners in this project include Exceptional Community Hospital – Maricopa, and the local public and charter schools. This project has not been funded by any other Arizona tribe, nor have requests for funding been made on behalf of this project.

#### C. Reports

Detailed reporting will be provided to the Community regarding the use of all grant funds received. Be Awesome Youth Coalition will adhere to the spending outlined in the grant proposal and spend the resources according to the proposed budget. Proof of expenditures will be provided as part of a detailed analysis upon completion of the project, including how many youth obtained the free physical exam services as well as demographic information identifying the population served. Further, information on the identification of potential cardiomyopathy will be provided, in accordance with health care information privacy laws.

- Medical Equipment: Additional medical equipment necessary to complete
  exams in a timely manner. Acquisition of this equipment will increase this
  programs inventory that can be used for future events and programs that
  benefit the community. Equipment will include additional testing to diagnose
  cardiomyopathy, which is not traditionally included in athletic exams.
  Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy is viewed as the most common condition
  responsible for sudden cardiac death in young athletes. These deaths are
  preventable if a diagnosis is made prior to involvement in athletics and proper
  medical care is received.
- Medical Staffing: Exceptional Community Hospital Maricopa will also be
  donating their own medical equipment and staff resources to help facilitate the
  project. The medical staffing required for the project includes paying additional
  doctors at the rate of \$325/hour to staff the physical exams to ensure that all of
  the youth can be seen in a timely manner.
- Screen Felx Portable Room Dividers: necessary to create portable medical exam rooms. Acquisition of the dividers will increase the programs inventory which can be used for future events, and additional projects that can benefit the community.
- Set Up, Installation, Storage: will be contracted to create portable medical exam rooms using the Screenflex portable room dividers.

- Advertising: used to place ads in the local newspapers including the Maricopa Monitor, Ak-Chin O'odham Runner and InMaricopa. Ads will run for at least a month prior to the project date to ensure that we reach all potential participants. Additional advertising is covered by Be Awesome through Promo subscription which provides licensing for professional video, music, and templates which can be distributed on social media platforms.
- Contractors: a portion of monthly accounting to assist admin with monitoring, recording, and reporting financials and completing tax information. Fees for accounting software for nonprofits.
- Admin and Coordinator: This will include an administrator to help oversee financial reporting and oversite and assist with scheduling and supervising staff who will assist with setting up events for physicals and promoting events and opportunities for physicals through tabling at local events, and public places such as the local community center and library and coordinating with Exceptional Community Hospital, and schools.
- Fringe: Be Awesome uses an 11.02% fringe rate for benefits which are broken down to include:
