



# Legislative Summary

2018

# Session Overview

- There were 1328 bills, memorials and resolutions posted. 369 bills passed and 23 vetoed. The session lasted 116 days, ending on May 4<sup>th</sup> at 12:26 A.M.

# Pertinent Issues:

- PTSD; worker's compensation; presumption (HB2501)-passed as HB2502 S/E, but amended to expanding # of counseling sessions
- Video service; certificates of authority (HB2579)-passed as SB1140, preserved ROW management, delayed effective date of 1-1-20
- TPT; digital goods & services (SB1392 & HB2479) -failed

# Pertinent Issues

- Occupational regulation; municipalities; counties (SB 1404 & HB2352) –passed as HB2352, need review of regulations now
- Government property; abatement; slum; blight (HB 2126) –passed, decreases CBD from 5% of city to 2.5%
- Home based businesses; local regulations (HB2333) - failed

# Pertinent Issues:

- Mobile food vendors; state licensure (HB2371) –passed, vast amount of stakeholder work
- Campaign finance; candidate committee; transfers (HB 2182) -failed

# Pertinent Issues:

- Vehicle fees; alternative fuel VLT (HB2166) –passed, new highway safety fee, eventual increase in VLT for alt.-fuel vehicles
- County excise tax for transportation (SB1146) -failed
- Budget – increase in HURF, no 911 sweep, continued payment to DOR
